ENG 100 Intro to College Reading & Wri (4)

Class Hours: 72 Lecture

Prerequisite(s): Requires a minimum score on the English Placement Exam.

Transfers to: Not transferable

Intro to College Reading and Writing

ENG 100 is an introduction to the development of college-level reading, writing, and related skills. Students will focus on the connections with reading and writing in an academic setting. This course is preparation for ENG 51A and requires a minimum score on the English Placement Exam.(NDA)

ENG 001A Composition and Reading (3)

Class Hours: 54 Lecture

Prerequisite(s): ENG 051A

Transfers to: Transfers to both UC/CSU

C-ID: ENGL 100

Composition and Reading

English 001A is a transfer-level theory and practice in reading and composition. The reading and writing include exposition and argumentation in rhetorical patterns such as narration, description, comparison/contrast, etc., or combination of such patterns. At least one written research project is included-one ten- page term paper or two five-page research papers- to provide training in bibliographical techniques and the use of library facilities.(C-ID ENGL 100) (AA/AS, CSU, UC)

ENG 001B Literature/Crit Think&writing (3)

Class Hours: 54 Lecture

Prerequisite(s): ENG 001A

Transfers to: Transfers to both UC/CSU

C-ID: ENGL 120

Literature/ Critical Thinking & Writing

English 001B is designed to develop reading, critical thinking, and writing skills beyond the level achieved in English 1A. It will develop critical thinking skills in response to literature. (C-ID ENGL 120) (AA/AS,CSU, UC)

ENG 002 Introduction to Literature (3)

Class Hours: 54 Lecture

Prerequisite(s): ENG 001A

Transfers to: Transfers to both UC/CSU

Introduction to Literature

ENG 002 introduces representative works from major genres, develops students' close reading and analytical writing skills, and promotes appreciation and critical understanding of the cultural, historical and aesthetic qualities of literature. (C-ID ENGL 120)(AA/AS, CSU)

ENG 003 Argumentative Writ & Crit Thin (3)

Class Hours: 54 Lecture

Prerequisite(s): ENG 001A

Transfers to: Transfers to both UC/CSU

Argumentative Writ & Crit Thinking

ENG 003 offers instruction in argumentation and critical writing, critical thinking, analytical evaluation of primarily non-fiction texts, research strategies, information literacy, and proper documentation. (AA/AS, CSU)

ENG 004 World Literature (3)*Class Hours:* 54 Lecture*Prerequisite(s):* ENG 001A*Transfers to:* Transfers to both UC/CSU

World Literature

ENG 004 is a comparative study of selected works, in translation and in English, of literature from around the world, including Europe, the Middle East, Asia, and other areas, from the mid or late seventeenth century to the present. Special attention is given to critical thinking and writing within a framework of cultural diversity as well as comparative and interdisciplinary analysis. A goal of the course is to promote an understanding of the works in their cultural, historical, and political contexts and of the enduring human values that unite the different literary traditions. (C-ID ENGL 145)(AA/AS, CSU)

ENG 025 Intro to Creative Writing (3)*Class Hours:* 54 Lecture*Take ENG-51A:**Transfers to:* Transfers to both UC/CSU

Introduction to Creative Writing

ENG 025 provides theory and practice in the writing of different genres, such as poetry, fiction, and creative nonfiction. Through the study and analysis of the works of established and peer writers, students will gain experience in different genres. Students will practice writing in various genres and will be introduced to the workshop method. (AA/AS, CSU, UC)

ENG 051A Intro. to Communication Skills (3)*Class Hours:* 54 Lecture*Prerequisite(s); ENG 101B, ENG 105B, or ENG 100:**Transfers to:* Not transferable

Introduction to Communication Skills

English 051A provides instruction for students who do not make a satisfactory score on an English placement test for English 1A. This course aids students in developing the necessary skills and experiences to make them effective readers, writers, and speakers. The course provides practice in reading, in writing essays of 500 words or more, and in verbal communication. (AA/AS)

ENG 070 Adaptive Reading (0.5 - 1)*Class Hours:* 54 Laboratory*Transfers to:* Not transferable

English 070 is designed primarily for students with learning disabilities. The content of the class relates primarily to the fundamentals of reading and related language arts. Students work toward individualized and group instructional objectives. Reading will be taught in the context of other language and life skills. May be repeated as many times as necessary to achieve course objectives.(AA)
